

International Representation Funding Criteria (Effective from 01/03/2018)

Background

Scottish Archery may provide financial assistance to affiliated Scottish archers who are selected to represent Great Britain at self-funded international competitions. Funding is available to both Junior and Senior archers. The following criteria are now in place for archers applying for funding.

Objectives of Funding International Representation

- Allow elite archers from Scotland the opportunity to represent Great Britain (GB) and gain experience and results that would allow them to access other funding streams in the future through world ranking position, AGB funded programmes and sponsorship
- Ensure cost is not a barrier to high performance Scottish archers

Basis of Awarding Funding

- The applicant being eligible to shoot for Scotland under the eligibility criteria
- Eligible to shoot for GB
- The applicant demonstrating that they can be competitive at an international level
- The applicant not being in receipt of AGB funding for the trip
- Scottish Archery not exceeding the maximum amount allocated for international representation in a given year (currently £4000 per annum)

Applicant Process

- Applications for funding must be received within two weeks of the event ending which will be defined as the day on which medals for the event are awarded
- Applications should be emailed to Scottish Archery administration with details of event, including where the applicant has placed a link to the results and a breakdown of the cost of the trip
- Applications will be considered by the Director of Performance along with at least two other board members, the applicant will be informed of the outcome within two weeks of submission

Conditions

- Funding may only be used to compensate for travel, accommodation, and entry fees for GB representation at recognised events
- Archers must provide receipts when available to support their applications
- Archers receiving funding from Scottish archery are required to acknowledge financial support when announcing or highlighting their achievements on social media
- Archers must provide a report (joint reports are encouraged) for the website alongside their application

Funding Criteria

Seniors, Junior and Cadets who are selected for a GB team for non-funded trips can apply for up to 60% of the cost of the trip not exceeding £600 for a single event, any individual will not receive more than £1000 in a calendar year.

Individual, team, and mixed team achievements can be used in conjunction with one another to obtain up to 60% (maximum £600).

There must be a minimum of sixteen participants in an individual category and eight teams within a team category to obtain the full 60% or £600. If this is not the case, then a multiplier based on actual number of competitors divided by sixteen for individual or eight for team events will be used.

There is a £150 base level of funding available to those who meet the above 'Criteria', and 'Conditions', this is included as part of the £1000 limit per person in a year but is in addition

to the £600 or 60% of the trip cost. This base level of funding is also subject to the 'Basis of Award Funding'.

Individual Achievement

Team and Mixed Team Achievement

| Bronze | 6% | £60 |

Examples of Multiplier

If a bronze medal is won individually in a category where there are only twelve participants, then the awarded amount will be $48 \times \frac{12}{16} = 36\%$ for trips costing less than £1000 or $£480 \times \frac{12}{16} = £360$ for trips costing more than £1000.

Matters Not Covered

Any matters arising which are not covered within this policy including behaviour deemed unbecoming of a member of Scottish Archery leading to a reduction or complete denial of funding shall be determined by the Director of Performance and two other board members at their complete discretion.
