



## **ANNUAL CLASSIFICATION AWARD SCHEME**

Following on from our survey for members who do not compete, and taking into account the comments made, Scottish Archery is introducing a new classification award scheme for senior archers of 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1<sup>st</sup> and Bowman class levels, shooting scores during the outdoor season. The purpose of this award scheme is to recognise and reward archers from these levels and to also give club archers something to aim for, which will hopefully encourage more members to come out and shoot throughout the outdoor season.

The scheme will have an annual award for the highest ranking archer in each division and gender for each of these 4 levels of outdoor classifications.  
For the purposes of this scheme archers are not required to have a full Scottish Ranking.

### **Criteria**

Archers will be required to shoot a minimum of three 12 dozen rounds, between the 1<sup>st</sup> April and the 30<sup>th</sup> of September each year. Any York/Hereford round submitted will be converted to an equivalent WA 1440 score for comparison.

The awards ranking list will then be made up of each archers' top three classification scores.

The highest ranking archer in each of the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1<sup>st</sup>, and Bowman classes, in each gender and bow division, will then receive an annual award.

The Classification ranking list will be routinely updated with the main Scottish Rankings and published on the Scottish Archery website throughout the season to encourage archers to participate in the scheme.

Archers will not be required to submit any scores shot in Scotland. Only scores shot outwith Scotland need to be submitted as per the instructions in the main outdoor ranking criteria which can be found on the Scottish Archery website.
