

## Team Scotland Kit Policy

In order to maintain the highest standards and be presented in a professional manner at all Scotland Team events we require all Archers to adhere to the following:

- All kit shall be appropriate as indicated by the Team Manager for each event.
- The dress code whilst travelling to and from events is casual clothing, however official Scottish Archery Canterbury kit is recommended.
- Dress code to Banquets is a kilt or grey trousers for men with a white shirt. Women are to wear either a tartan skirt or trousers with a white shirt or blouse, or a black dress or trousers with tartan shawl or sash, Scottish Archery branded ties and scarfs are optional but encouraged.
- Alterations to Scotland kit may only be carried out on the authority of the Performance Director.
- No individual sponsorship or company logo's/badges may be added to team clothing.
- Current Scotland Shirts belongs to Scottish Archery and must only be worn by the individual athlete; it must not be swapped, worn by friends and family or given away.
- Scotland Team shirts may only be worn with plain navy blue trousers, shorts or skirt, or the official Canterbury Scottish Archery trousers.
- The Scotland shirt must have the wearer's surname printed on the back. Ideally the lettering will be 8.5cm in height, but may be larger if the surname is short. The colour of the lettering is navy blue.
- Archers wearing the Scotland shirt must be smart and tidy in appearance at all times and adhere to the code of conduct.
- One Scotland Team shirt will be provided to Team members for free. If selected for future teams, they will not receive a new shirt, but can purchase additional ones at any time.
- There are additional optional items of kit available to purchase for Team members. Only Team members are permitted to wear this kit. Team members from the 2015 team are able to purchase items retrospectively.
- Shirts should not be worn when not on the team at events where there is a Scotland team fielded.
