This document will act as a guide to the Scottish Archery Records. This is a working document and will be subject to change. For any queries or improvements, please contact the Records Group at:

Record claims should be made within 4 weeks of the competition being shot. Records will be updated on a monthly basis (We process claims one month after submission to allow time for results sheets etc to be published). [GB is 7 days]

Those individuals that can claim Scottish Records should be:

- Members of a Scottish Archery Association registered club

Or direct SAA members who either:

- Are Scottish by birth
- Have a Scottish relative (up to grandparent)
- Have lived continuously in Scotland for 2+ years

For rounds which a record can be claimed, please see AGB rules of shooting, 308 and 405. Rounds shot at events such as Kings or Archery, Lancaster Classic etc are not valid rounds as they are not compatible with the UK and Scottish records criteria. For example, rounds that have the full gold as 10 with no 9 and rounds the X ring as 11 plus the 12 ring.

Archers may only claim for their age group and adult records. E.g. an archer aged 13 can only claim for U14 and Adult records and not U15 to U21 records.

Masters and under 21s can also claim the same rounds as men/women e.g., WA70, WA1440(90), WA1440(70) etc.

Any eligible round may be claimed from a tournament with Scottish Record Status or above.

A new record shall be established when a score 1 point higher or in flight shooting one foot further than the existing record.

In the case of a perfect score shot in a target outdoor WA or Archery GB Metric round, a new record shall include the number of inner 10s (x) and shall require at least 1 more x than the existing record.

Should a record be broken by two or more equal scores, made on the same day, the archers shall be declared joint record holders.

For double rounds both the first or second half can be claimed as a single round e.g. in a double Portsmouth the 2nd half can be claimed as a single Portsmouth.

When a record has been broken the successful archer will be emailed a Scottish Archery Certificate. The certificates will no longer be posted as this is in line with other organisations and in the interest of reducing our impact on the environment.

World Archery terminology will now be used for genders, i.e. Men & Women.

- Under 12 (Women)– Archers aged 11 and under
- Under 12 (Men) Archers aged 11 and under
- Under 14 (Women) Archers aged 13 and under
- Under 14 (Men) Archers aged 13 and under
- Under 15 (Women) Archers aged 14 and under

- Under 18 (Women) Archers aged 17 and under
- Under 18 (Men) Archers aged 17 and under

- Men Archers aged 21 and over
- 50+ (Women) Archers aged 50 and over
- 50+ (Men) Archers aged 50 and over

Rule Examples Regarding Age

- An archer aged 15 A competition takes place in September; the archer is 15 on 1 July – they will take part in the Under 16 class.
- An archer aged 49 A competition takes place in April, the archer is 50 in November they can take part in a 50+ Class in tournaments.
- If an archer is under 14 this year, they would be able to claim both records (U15 and U16) providing they shot the appropriate round for the U15 and U16. The age group they are in is based on how old they are THIS year.

Records and Rounds

The tables below show the records and recommended rounds available to each age group. Note that:

- All current records will continue to stand. New records can be claimed throughout the season.
- Only these rounds or rounds of a longer distance for an age group will be eligible for records e.g., under 12 shooting a National 40 can claim a record but a under 15 shooting a National 30 cannot.

Rounds That Can be Claimed Per Age Group

Any round can be claimed as a single or a double.

This list of available rounds for each age group is in the interest of development and focuses on age-specific rounds.

Records can be claimed for higher rounds than your age group or gender specific round (e.g. women shooting a WA1440 (90m)) but in the interest of safety archers should only shoot rounds that they are comfortable with.
