Guidance notes for Tournament Organisers

This document is intended to become a record of your competition. The information in the completed document will be used by Archery GB to process the records and awards of the archers, monitor that tournaments are run in accordance with the procedures and as evidence for granting Record Status to future events.

Judge Status

World Record Status, Olympic & Compound Match (Head to Head) tournaments must be supervised by a National Judge (minimum).

Other World Record Status tournaments must be supervised by a Regional Judge (minimum). UK Record Status tournaments must be supervised by a Regional Judge (minimum).

Changes to Tournament Details

Please notify Archery GB of changes to the detail in the initial application as soon as possible.

Tournament Cancellation

Unfortunately, refunds are not available for cancelled tournaments; however, minor changes will be accommodated where possible. This may be subject to an admin fee.
