## World Record Status (WRS) Competitions

World Record Status (WRS): This is the highest level of competition and is the most strictly controlled. The only rounds that can achieve WRS are World Archery Rounds.

Shooting in these competitions gives you the opportunity to claim World, European and National Records as well as World Archery Performance Awards.

These competitions will have at least one National Judge present and will be controlled using traffic lights, whistles and occasionally countdown clocks to let you know when to shoot.

- These competitions are endorsed by the area/region and Archery GB. World,
   European and UK records may be claimed for target and flight.
- World Archery Target awards; WA Star, WA Silver Star and WA Target may be claimed.
- Archery GB Six Gold and Three Gold badges may be claimed.
- Scores for target and flight Classifications may be obtained.

## UK Record Status (UKRS) Competitions

The rounds shot can be either Archery GB or World Archery. At these events you have the opportunity to shoot National Records and some of these competitions also have Rose Award status.

These competitions will have at least one Regional Judge present.

These competitions are endorsed by Archery GB.

UK records may be claimed for target, flight and clout:

- Archery GB Six Gold, Three Gold and Six Clout Gold Imperial badges may be claimed.
- Archery GB Rose badges may be claimed if the competition has been granted
   Rose status.
- Clout Tassel awards may be claimed from Northern Counties Archery Society.
   The event must be Tassel status but not necessarily UK record status.
- Scores for target and flight Classifications may be obtained.

# Scottish Record Status (SRS) Competitions

SRS are recognised by Scottish Archery only. Results for these events do not go to AGB. You do however need to let Scottish Archery know that you are planning an event and have the details put onto the events page.

The Scottish Archery Thistle Badges can be claimed at these competitions. Thistle badges originated at the Skye Shoot held at the Clan Donald Centre on Skye. They were rolled out for use at other Scottish Archery competitions and events. Now they can be claimed for scores attained in any WA 1440 rounds and metrics; badges start at 900 and go up to 1300 in 100 increments. The badges are white topped for Juniors, red for Compounders and blue for Recurve and Barebow.

## Scottish Ranking Event (SRE) Competitions

SRE are competitions that are run in club time by a Field Captain. Results are submitted to Scottish rankings. For full details please see Criteria for Scottish Ranking Events, which you can view here.
