



Scottish National Team Eligibility Criteria 2024

During 2024, Scottish Archery will potentially select Under 21, Senior and 50+ representative teams to shoot for Scotland at the following events:

- Home Nations Indoor Competition
- Home National Outdoor Competition
- Commonwealth Archery Competition Europe (CACE)
- Any other event that sits against our representative strand

Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible to shoot for the Scotland National Team, one or more of the following must apply to you:

- You were born in Scotland OR
- You have at least one parent or grandparent born in Scotland OR
- You have been a continuous resident in Scotland for 2 years or more**

You must also have attended a UKAD Clean Sport Workshop organised by Scottish Archery, or have certificate of completion for the “100% me athlete eLearning course Compete Clean+” obtained for free via the UKAD Clean Sport Hub

In line with the published selection criteria, you may be required to submit scores. To confirm eligibility, you must also be a current member of Scottish Archery* at the point when selection scores are submitted. Any selection scores submitted must have been shot whilst being a member of ArcheryGB or other World Archery-affiliated Federation.

Potential Exceptions

Those who have represented another World Archery Federation, apart from Great Britain, in the twelve months prior to the event are not eligible to shoot for Scotland.

If you have represented another Home Nation (Wales, Northern Ireland, England) in the twelve months prior to the Event, or have not been formally released by that Home Nation after this time has elapsed, you are not eligible to shoot for Scotland.

** Continuous residency is defined as living in Scotland a minimum of 183 days in a year
