

Domestic Competitions Funding Criteria

Background

Scottish Archery may provide financial assistance to current member of Scottish Archery who have paid all due membership fees and who achieve success at high level domestic UK competitions. The following criteria are now in place for archers applying for funding.

Objectives of Funding

- Ensure cost is not a barrier to high performance Scottish archers

Basis of Awarding Funding

- The applicant being eligible to shoot for Scotland under the eligibility criteria pertinent at the time
- Eligible to shoot for Team GB
- Scottish Archery not exceeding the maximum amount allocated for domestic competitions in a given year (currently £3000 per annum)

Applicant Process

- Applications for funding must be received within a week of the event ending
- Applications should be emailed to Scottish Archery administration with details of event, including where the applicant has placed a link to the results and a breakdown of the cost of the trip

- Applications will be considered by the Director of Performance and the Performance subcommittee

Conditions

- Funding may only be used to compensate for travel, accommodation, and entry fees
- Archers must provide receipts to support their applications (we acknowledge that receipts will not normally be provided for competition entry fees, for this expense a copy of results will suffice)
- Archers receiving funding from Scottish archery are required to acknowledge financial support when announcing or highlighting their achievements on social media

Eligible Competitions

- Any Archery GB recognised national championships and finals events
- Any Archery GB tier 1 and Tier 2+ events (see Archery GB national ranking rules)
- Youth key event stages

Funding Criteria

There must be a minimum of thirty-two participants in an individual category, if this is not the case, then a multiplier based on actual number of competitors divided by thirty-two will be used to decide the awarded funding.

No individual can receive more the £600 worth of funding in a twelve-month period.

Position Achieved	Maximum Awarded Amount
Gold	£200
Silver	£180
Bronze	£150
4 th	£100

Examples of Multiplier

If a bronze medal is won individually in a category where there are only sixteen participants, then the awarded amount will be up to $£150 \times \frac{16}{32} = £75$.

If a silver medal is won individually in a category where there are only twelve participants, then the awarded amount will be up to $£180 \times \frac{12}{32} = £67.50$.

Matters Not Covered

Any matters arising which are not covered within this policy shall be dealt with by the Director of Performance and the performance subcommittee.

Athletes are expected to comply with codes of conduct and any athlete agreements they may be a part of. Failure to do so may lead to action being taken in line with the disciplinary procedures and possible reductions in funding.
